

Copmanthorpe Photographic Competition Rules

Purpose:

- To build on the archive of pictures of the village currently held in Copmanthorpe Library These are largely composed of the Sanderson Collection bequeathed to the village by Ernest Sanderson.
- To encourage residents to recognise the built, natural and human environment of Copmanthorpe and become involved in preserving it
- To generate community involvement

Prizes:

- Prize winners in each category and an overall winner will be chosen by an independent judge.
- Certificates will be awarded for second and third in each category/age group
- Prizes will be awarded to winners in each category/age group
- The overall winner each year will receive an engraved cup (to be held by the winner for the year) paid for out to the recent bequest and entitled the Chapman-Andrews Cup

Categories:

- Age Groups:
 - 4 – 11
 - 12 – 18
 - 18+
- Categories:
 - Copmanthorpe built environment
 - Copmanthorpe natural environment
 - Copmanthorpe human environment

Rules:

- It is a condition of entry that the Parish Council will have free licence to use all images entered in the competition, that the Village Newsletter will be freely allowed to use the images and that all original prints and/or digital files entered will be stored by the Parish Council and may be displayed in Copmanthorpe library in perpetuity
- Closing date for entries:
 - 31 Oct 2015
- It is the responsibility of the photographer to certify that he or she is the sole owner and author of each entry and that you have the right to make your entry available to the competition
- It is the responsibility of the photographer to ensure that each entry does not contain personally identifiable information about you or any other person and that each entry does not contain any infringing, threatening, misleading, abusive, harassing, libellous, defamatory, vulgar, obscene, scandalous, inflammatory, pornographic or profane content
- It is the responsibility of the photographer to ensure that each entry does not contain any material that could constitute or encourage conduct which would be considered a criminal offence, give rise to civil liability, or otherwise violate any law
- It is the responsibility of the photographer to ensure that each entry does not infringe upon the copyrights, trademarks, contract rights or any other intellectual property rights of any third person or entity or violate any person's rights of privacy or publicity and that your entry does not include:
 - a. trademarks owned by third parties
 - b. copyrighted materials owned by third parties (including movie dialogue or musical compositions)
 - c. names, likenesses, voices or other characteristics identifying celebrities or other public figures, living or dead
 - d. screen credits
- All entrants agree to fully indemnify Copmanthorpe Parish Council in respect of all royalties, fees and any other monies owing to any person by reason of an entry breaching any of the foregoing
- All entrants confirm that each person depicted in each entry has granted permission to be portrayed as shown
- Entrants under 16 years of age must have their parent's or legal guardian's consent to participate in the competition
- Entrants must be resident in the village at the time the photograph was taken

- All entries must be in the form of prints measuring no less than 8" x 6" and no larger than 10" x 15" and be mounted on stiff card for display purposes
- Where entries are originally in digital format a digital file must also be submitted. Digital files must be no smaller than 800KB and no larger than 5MB and be either jpeg or tiff format
- The judge's decisions will be final and no correspondence will be entered into
